- 6. Reports
 - a. Principal (Ms. Resch)
 - i. School Leadership
 - Principal Shelton continues to serve as an Independent School Principal (ISP), she sits on the "*Utilization of diverse student-level data to drive instructional improvement*" working group.

- Group focuses on using data to drive instructional gains for students and will include site visits.
- Principal Shelton also serves on the Principal Advisory
 Committee who advice CAO Janice Jackson on issues relating to policies that affect principals.
- Math Team's SMART goal: raise the number of students reaching their growth targets on NWEA
- Literacy Team is focused on writing across the curricula and is collaborating to integrate content with the Social Studies and STEM teams.
- MTSS team is focused on targeted instruction for those students performing under grade level, who are without an IEP but need additional support based on teacher recommendations or academic achievement.
- ILT looking at NWEA data. ILT is driving PD plan internally, especially for Thursday afternoon PD (teacher driven)
- Lighthouse Team continues to focus on school climate and culture

ii. Instructional Leadership

- Erikson Partnership: Ongoing PD and support to create
 thematic units that incorporate social studies and STEM into
 the literacy block. This includes for math: Math Talks and
 Number Streams, and for ELA/Social Studies: Lucy Calkins and
 Facing History. Both promote and support collaboration
 amongst teachers- which research shows drives instructional
 improvement.
- Mastery Connect (MC) is amping up in 2nd semester and will be more embedded in formative assessment. Going to Gwendolyn Brooks school who use MC in January – this came about because of ISP designation.

- Math Team is also using IXL, an online program that targets specific areas of need. All questions are linked to CCSS which will be helpful for NWEA and PARCC. IXL is in place for grades
 5 -8 and 4th will be incorporated in January
- Front Row Ed is another web-based program in use for reading comprehension and math
- iii. Student-Centered Learning Climate
 - Boy's 5th/6th grade and 7th/8th grade football teams were
 Network champions
 - Upcoming out of uniform days will raise money for the 8th grade trip.
 - Next week is PBIS Spirit Week (Positive Behavior Intervention Support): sports day, College Week, Halloween (character from literature).
 - Upcoming NED Show: Character education assembly (Never Give up, Encourage others, Do your best)
 - Winter fine arts performances 12/10 for K-1, 12/16 for 2-8. General music and band, with the Chicago Children's Choir
 - Wellness Fieldtrip: The 4th grade went to Jones College Prep for physical fitness stations led by Jones' PE leaders (honors PE students)
 - Lyric Opera at Jones: 5th/6th grade students went to a workshop and performance hosted by the Lyric Opera at Jones College Prep
 - Sphynx Virtuosi String Ensemble performed for 4th graders
- Leadership Luncheons: honor South Loop Leaders of the Month. These have been funded by the administration, looking to support with additional fundraising in the community. CPS has limited support.

- Beta Club Service Projects: Food Drive in November, winter accessory and toy drive for families in the Roseland Community
- iv. Professional Development and Human Resource Management
 - Thursday Professional Development is ongoing: ILT-planned, teacher-led PD, meets every Thursday through January.

 Topics include: differentiation/meeting standards at different levels of attainment; MasteryConnect and action-planning on its implementation; Leader in me, Advisory, Leadership Binders; meeting the needs of diverse leaner's (IEPs, 504s) and the legal requirements/ramification of implementing accommodations and modifications.
 - Facing History and Erickson includes ongoing coaching including classroom observations and leadership and support for distributed leadership.
 - New Hires: Ms. Beals is now full time at the Branch (Diverse Learner Specialist); new diverse learner teacher and a paraprofessional hired to meet needs.
- v. Parent Involvement & Community Partnerships
- Common Threads Afterschool cooking program (3-5)
 wrapped up this past Tuesday. Next session begins in January.
 Family cooking class begins in January and will be on Thursday
 nights. Still looking for three more families to participate. Chef
 Fabio Viviani (Italian Chef, restaurateur, reality television
 personality) will be hosting a workshop for 5th grade classes.
 The class that gets the visit will be the class whose parents
 volunteer the most for kiss-n-go for 5th grade
- STEAM Grant: Carrie Dahlquist and Resh are working to find a curriculum project/partnership to augment the 4th grade

- science curriculum. Reaching out to museum and university folks to design work in physical science in 4th grade.
- Student Led Conferences were held for report card pick up: good turnout, students led their conferences, in-line with the Leader in Me initiative. SLCs demonstrate ownership of learning, accomplishments and success looked different in lower grade. We are doing more to support the implementation of SLCs in 2nd semester.
- Café moms: 2nd grade volunteer program is going really well
- Safety patrol: 3-5 grade kiss-n-go has been successful. Would like more involvement from 5th grade parents.
- Still need for volunteers: would like parent networks to reach out to recruit more volunteers to support our efforts.
- vi. School Management & Daily Operations
 - Kameli fundraiser (\$9k-\$10k) went towards bathrooms, and over the summer they hope to raise money for classrooms.
 - All hallways and bathrooms will be painted over break, to move forward with painting the classrooms more fundraising will need to be done.
 - CPS will replace the tiles in the south stairwell
 - Technology working with carts now, want to have a 1:1 laptop initiative with 5th-8th grade.
 - Staff are working on publicity with different #hashtag posts. Go
 Fund Me, need \$80k for 200 netbooks, currently have 180. Go
 Fund Me page will go live next week with a student directed
 video.
